Turning a Quilt/Block O- Point The Easy Way

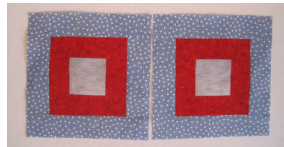
This is a very simple but effective way to turn any quilt or quilt block on point. No need to measure .

How is it done? Simply make two courthouse step blocks or two log cabin blocks. Instead of measuring, every once in a while fold it in half (corner to corner) and check to see if it covers one side of the center square. It doesn't need to be exact, just bigger than the center.

Here we go with an example of a center block. As you can see, it definitely needs to be turned on-point.

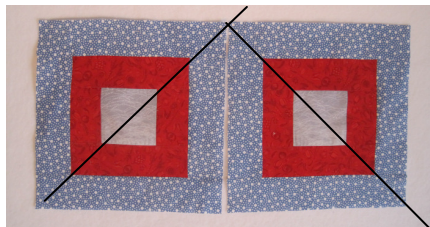


Make two blocks at the same time so that they are exactly alike.

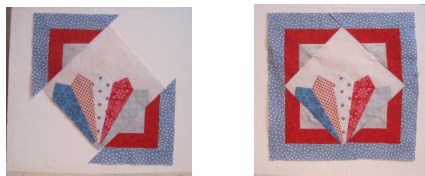


Once again, check to make sure they are big enough. Fold in half on the diagonal and make sure they entirely cover (or bigger) the side of your block.

Once you're sure they are big enough cut each of them on the diagonal.



Center each half on a side of the block and sew in place. Sew upper left and lower right first. Press to the outside and then sew the upper right and lower left in place. Press.



TA-DA! You've successfully turned a quilt block on-point.
